## Voter's Bill of Rights

Each registered voter in this state has the right to:

1. Vote and have his or her vote accurately counted
2. Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county
3. Ask for and receive assistance in voting
4. Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast
5. An explanation if his or her registration or identity is in question
6. If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.
7. Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from elections officers
8. Vote free from coercion or intimidation by elections officers or any other person
9. Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast

## Voter's Responsibilities

Each registered voter in this state should:

1. Familiarize himself or herself with the candidates and issues
2. Maintain with the office of the Supervisor of Elections a current address
3. Know the location of his or her polling place and its hours of operation
4. Bring proper identification to the polling station
5. Familiarize himself or herself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct
6. Treat precinct workers with courtesy
7. Respect the privacy of other voters
8. Report any problems or violations of election laws to the Supervisor of Elections
9. Ask questions, if needed
10. Make sure that his or her completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station

**NOTE TO VOTER:** Failure to perform any of these responsibilities does not prohibit a voter from voting

# Voter Registration

To be eligible to register to vote you must:

- Be a United States Citizen
- Be a Florida resident
- Be 18 or older – you may pre-register at 16
- Not a convicted felon or your civil rights have been restored
- Not have been adjudicated mentally incompetent or your competency rights have been restored

## Deadline to Register to Vote

You may apply to register to vote at any time. However, the registration books for new registrants close 29 days prior to each election. Updates to your name, address and signature are accepted at any time. Political party changes made after the registration books close for a primary election will not become effective until after the election.

## Signature Change

Has your signature changed? When you return a Vote by Mail ballot or sign a petition, your signature is verified against the signature we have on file. If the signatures do not match, your ballot may not be counted or your petition may not be accepted.

A signature change can only be accomplished by completing and mailing a Voter Registration Application to the Supervisor of Elections. Applications are available at the following:

# Election Information

## Primary Election

Florida is a closed primary state. Eligible voters will be permitted to vote the official ballot of the political party in which they are registered.

## Universal Primary Contest

A Universal Primary Contest (UPC) occurs when a race has qualified candidates of the same party and there is no opposition in the General Election. All registered voters, regardless of their party affiliation, are eligible to vote in this race.

If you are a registered Democrat, you will be eligible to vote the following in a primary:

- Democratic races containing two or more Democratic candidates
- Universal Primary Contests
- Nonpartisan races
- Judicial
- School Board
- Referendums

If you are a registered Republican, you will be eligible to vote the following in a primary:

- Republican races containing two or more Republican candidates
- Universal Primary Contests
- Nonpartisan races
- Judicial
- School Board
- Referendums

If you are registered with a Minor Party or No Party, you will be eligible to vote the following in a primary:

- Universal Primary Contests
- Nonpartisan races
- Judicial
- School Board
- Referendums

## General Election

General Elections are held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even numbered years. Every eligible voter, regardless of their party affiliation, is permitted to vote for any candidate on the ballot.

## Election Day

Polls are open from 7 am – 7 pm

Florida Statutes requires voters to vote in their precinct on Election Day. To verify your precinct:

You are required to provide a photo and signature identification in order to vote on Election Day. Acceptable forms:

- Florida driver license
- Florida identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles
- U.S. passport
- Debit or credit card
- Military identification
- Student identification
- Retirement center identification
- Neighborhood association identification
- Public assistance identification
- Veteran health identification card issued by the US Depart. Of Veterans Affairs
- A license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm
- Employee identification card issued by any branch, department, agency or entity of the Federal Government, the state, county or municipality

If your photo identification does not contain your signature, you will need to show additional identification that provides your signature.

You will then be asked to sign the precinct register or electronic poll book and allowed to vote. The poll worker will issue your ballot. If you make a mistake, ask for a replacement ballot. You may receive up to 2 replacement ballots.

### **Assistance**

If you require assistance for voting, please inform the Clerk. You may bring someone with you other than an employer or an officer of your union to assist you or the Clerk will assign two poll workers of two different political parties to assist.

## Early Voting

Early Voting is held 10 to 15 days prior to an Election. For **Primary Elections**, Early Voting will be conducted at the Elections Center located at 135 SE Martin Luther King, Jr., Blvd, Stuart.

## Vote By Mail

Per Florida Statute 101.62, all eligible voters may Vote by Mail. A voter or if directly instructed by the voter, a member of the voter's immediate family may request an absentee ballot by the following means:

- In person
- By mail
- By telephone
- By email
- [Martin Votes](#)

When requesting a Vote by Mail ballot, be prepared to supply the following Information:

- Voter's name
- Voter's address
- Voter's date of birth
- Address to mail the ballot – Vote by Mail ballots will not be forwarded
  - ❖ If ballot is to be mailed to a different address, request must be made in writing with a signature
- Voter's signature, if written request
- Requester's name
- Requester's address
- Requester's driver license number, if available
- Requester's relationship to the voter
- Requester's signature, if written request

A request for a Vote by Mail ballot to be mailed must be received by the Supervisor of Elections no later than 5 pm on the sixth day prior to the election.

A voter may also pick up their ballot at the Elections Center once the Vote by Mail ballots are available until 7 pm on Election Day.

Another option to receive a Vote by Mail ballot is to designate a person to pick up your ballot. A designee may pick up the ballot beginning 5 days prior to the Election. They must have signed, written authorization from the voter, present a picture I.D. and sign an affidavit.

Vote by Mail ballots must be mailed or dropped off to the Elections Center no later than 7 pm on the day of the election. Do not return your voted ballot to a precinct because it would not reach the Elections Center by 7 pm. If you have received a Vote by Mail ballot and choose to vote at your precinct, bring the unvoted ballot with you and it will be cancelled.

## Work the Polls

Become an Election Worker...

### What are Election Workers?

Poll Workers are registered voters who are appointed by the Supervisor of Elections to administer the election process at the precinct on Election Day. Poll Workers are responsible to insure the election process is administered fairly, efficiently and according to Florida Statutes.

There are different categories of poll workers:

- Clerk
- Assistant Clerk
- Inspector
- Voting Equipment Technician
- Poll Deputy

As an election worker you are required to be at your precinct by 5:45 am and remain until dismissed by the Clerk after the polls close at 7 pm.

### How Can I Become a Election Worker?

You may call the Supervisor of Elections Office, (772)288-5637, and request a poll worker application, or you may complete an [on-line request form](#). Once the application has been completed and sent to us, you will be contacted to attend an orientation session.
